Michigan wheat farmers annually plant more than 500,000 acres to red and white winter wheat in 50 of Michigan's 83 counties. Those acres produce a 45 million bushel crop utilized in delicious baked goods, cookies, crackers, and pastries.

MAEAP is a voluntary program that allows growers large and small to identify and prevent environmental risks on their farms. Following Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development's third party audit, growers receive a MAEAP sign, as well as verification that their practices are consistent with the identified Right to Farm Generally Accepted Agricultural & Management Practices and environmental regulations.

Many Michigan wheat producers are participating in MAEAP, illustrating the value farmers put on the environment and sustainability. The Michigan Wheat Program provides a financial incentive to growers that are MAEAP verified.
